Assistance: Grants for sound recording; grants to assist with the production and promotional costs of recording Canadian Jazz, Folk, First Peoples, World, Musique Actuelle, Canadian Classical, and New Music. A number of other music programs are available for Performance rehearsals, Songwriting, Composition and Creative time.

Application Deadline: Varies.

Program: Jean-Marie Beaudet Prize in Orchestra Conducting.

Assistance: Worth \$1,000, the Jean-Marie Beaudet Award is given annually to a young Canadian orchestra

conductor selected by the Music Advisory Committee of the Music Section of the Canada Council from among the staff conductors with Canadian orchestras.

Program: Bernard Diamant Prize.

Assistance: The Bernard Diamant Prize, worth \$5,000, offers professional Canadian classical singers under age 35 an opportunity to pursue their career through further studies. It will be awarded in addition to the regular grant to an outstanding young classical singer in the council's annual competition for Grants to Professional Musicians (Classical Music Grants). The prize is subject to the conditions of a grant, including the submission of a final report.

Program: Robert Fleming Prize.

Assistance: The \$2,000 Robert Fleming Prize, which is intended to encourage the careers of young creators of Music, is awarded annually in memory of Robert Fleming to the most talented Canadian Music composer in the grant competition for composers in classical music.

Program: Sylva Gelber Foundation Award.

Assistance: The Sylva Gelber Foundation Award is given annually to the most talented Canadian artist under the age of 30 in the grants to individuals competition for performers of classical music. The award, established in 1981, is worth \$15,000.

Program: Jules Léger Prize for New Chamber Music.

Assistance: Established in 1978 by the Right Honourable Jules Léger, then Governor General of Canada, the Jules Léger Prize is a \$7,500 national award designed to encourage Canadian composers to write for Chamber Music Groups and to foster the performance of Canadian Chamber Music by these groups. Three organizations are involved in the prize: the Canadian Music Centre, which administers the prize; the Canadian Council for the Arts, which funds and promotes the prize and selects the jury; and CBC Radio Music
